Here's a little story I'd like to share with you from "Seasons of the Spirit — Congregational Life", a commentary I keep in my office:

A man went fishing one afternoon. He cut a hole in the ice, put his line down and waited. Soon he heard a loud voice exclaim, "There are no fish here!" Startled, he looked around but did not see anyone, so he continued fishing. Soon he heard the voice a second time exclaim even louder, "There are no fish here!" Again, he scoured his surroundings, but still saw no one. And again he focused his concentration on catching fish from the hole he had cut on the ice. After a short period he heard the voice a third time. "There are no fish here!" With great concern and care he slowly looked all around again but still saw no one and could not tell where the voice was coming from. Then, he became frightened as he came to a sudden realization. Looking up he said, with his voice shaking, "God?" The voice ran back immediately. "No! This is the rink manager. There are no fish here!"

When I read this I chuckled a bit; then realized how many people in our world today are wondering where to find God. Even after our wonderful Easter celebration, when we get back to our day to day routines, it's easy to lose sight of the joy and promise of the resurrection.

John 20:19-31, the gospel text for the second Sunday of Easter, helps us to realize God's spirit present in the world today. And asks us to reflect where we see God. We are further challenged to think about our response to God. What story do you tell a follower of Christ?
